

Multilingual Medical Support Now Available!

A new OHDr. Medical Support Station has opened on the first floor of the passenger terminal, offering online health and medical consultations. Travelers can speak remotely with doctors in Japanese, English, or Chinese, and receive guidance on paid online consultations if needed.

The station is operated by Tokyo-based Joes Corporation, which runs the multilingual online health service OHDr. If you suddenly feel unwell or are not sure whether you need to see a doctor, stop by for assistance.

Location: Passenger Terminal Building, 1F (First Aid Room)
Consultation Hours: 11:00–17:00 (open daily)

*Health consultations do not include diagnosis or prescriptions.
*As consultations are conducted via computer, the station is unstaffed.

- Approx. 15 mins by car from Kyushu Expressway Mashiki-Kumamoto Airport I.C.
- Approx. 50 mins by airport limousine bus from Sakura Machi Kumamoto
